Must / have to

'**Must**' and '**have to**' are very similar. Both are very important responsibilities

'**Must**' is a personal (or internal) obligation or necessity.

'**Have to**' is an 'external' obligation (someone or something tell me to do to) or necessity; it is a little stronger than must.
